[1] TAX Implications of Debt Forgiveness

(1.50 Hours of MCLE Credit)

This panel will discuss the basics of cancellation of real property debts, exclusions for insolvency, bankruptcy and qualified real property indebtedness under IRC Section 108, and the application and ordering of tax attributes such as net operating losses and un-allowed passive activity losses.

[2] Uses and Abuses of Lis Pendens (1.50 Hours of MCLE Credit)

This program will address the origin, preparation, and recording of the notice of pendency of action ("*lis pendens*"), its effect on title to real property, and means available for its expungement or elimination. The panelists will also discuss remedies (including damages and attorneys fees) available to an owner whose property is affected by an improper or abusive *lis pendens*, and the availability of title insurance to circumvent a *lis pendens*. Recent legislation and appellate developments will also be discussed.
